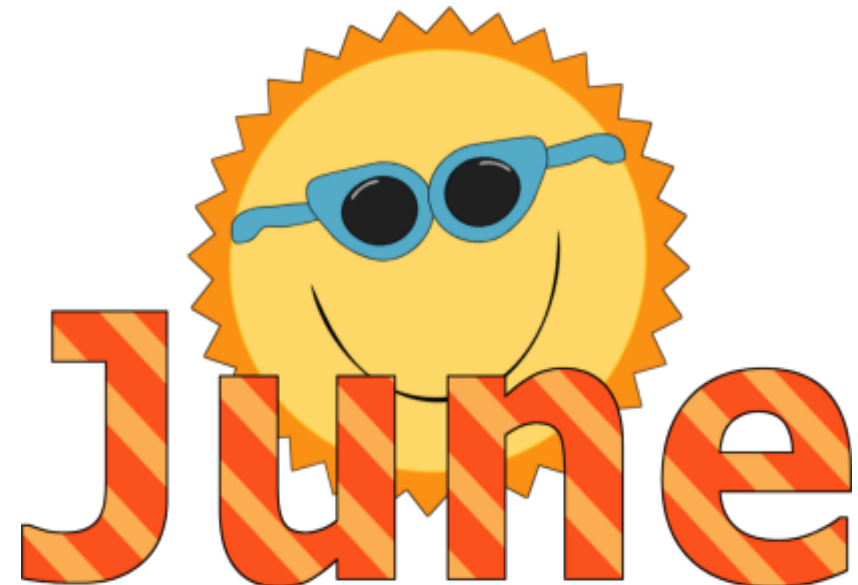

THE KEEP FIT KORNER

“I still have my feet on the ground; I just wear better shoes.” Oprah Winfrey

The shoes you wear should do a lot more than get you from Point A to Point B. A good pair should make you feel better and can protect you from falls, a leading cause of injury-related hospitalizations among older adults. Consider the following when choosing sneakers and shoes:

- A wide rubber sole with treads** – more sole contact with the ground increases stability, and treads provide traction.
- A medium-firm insole** – test firmness by pressing on the heel of the shoe’s bottom; it shouldn’t be too hard or too soft.
- A stiffer upper** – look for footwear with a somewhat rigid upper, especially around the back of the foot, to hug your foot for better balance.

Help for common problems:

- ➔ **Bunions or hammertoes** – footwear with a roomy toe box and flexible fabric, like nylon or mesh.
- ➔ **Plantar fasciitis** – footwear with good arch support eases discomfort.
- ➔ **Arthritis** – a rocker bottom (shoe front curves upward) can ease pain related to toe or knee osteoarthritis, or nerve damage (however, this can be a problem for anyone with balance issues).

Shoe types to avoid:

- Slip-on shoes** – feet are less secure than laced shoes, creating an unstable situation. Shoes with fabric fasteners, straps, or buckles are better.
 - Backless shoes** – encourage shuffling and you’re more likely to catch your foot and trip.
- Exercise and proper footwear will make you feel better and can protect you from falls.*

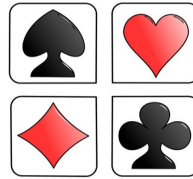

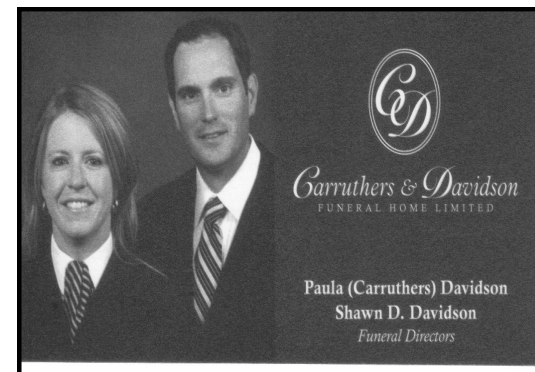
