I am currently working with a group in Wasaga Beach called Village of Hope. They provide lunches, personal hygiene products, socks, hats, mitts, winter coats, etc. twice a week to those in need. It's run entirely by hard working volunteers and totally funded by donations from people who want to help in some small way, those who are struggling in this difficult economic climate.

A small group of us are working on making mats from the 4-litre plastic milk bags. The mats help keep people dry and hopefully give a little comfort when sleeping on the cold, wet ground.


We have the knowledge and hands to make the mats, but each one takes at least 400 plastic milk bags!! WE NEED MILK BAGS! I'm asking if you might donate your milk bags. They can be dropped off at the Club. (I'm going to provide a container in the lobby to put them in).

The process of turning the bags into "plarn" to make the mats is labour intense, so if at all possible I would ask if you could open your bag and allow it to dry on the inside before folding it (or even better, if it smells, if you could give it a quick wash and let it dry). This will save a few steps for me, of having to wash, dry and then hang the bags all around my home and it will honestly save at least 3 hours labour per 150 bags.

Thanking you in advance so much for your help ...it really does take a Village.



Hello Prime Time Club members and welcome to the first of what I envision to be a monthly bulletin of the top two items most needed at the Wasaga Beach Ministerial Food Bank. To understand how stretched they are in providing food support in our community, let me share some statistics.

The volume of hampers distributed per month grew 32% from an average 298 in 2022 to 392 in 2023 and the majority of new clients are families. What saddens me the most is the 60% increase in children served which now approaches 400 per month (up from 250).

My vision for this monthly update is simple – let's try and top up food bank shelves each month with just the two most needed items. The top two for March are everyday staples for most of us \rightarrow peanut butter and jam.

You can bring them to the PT Club and place in the existing food bank bin which I'll monitor or donate directly to the food bank during operating hours (Tuesdays from 10 am to 1 pm and 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm).


