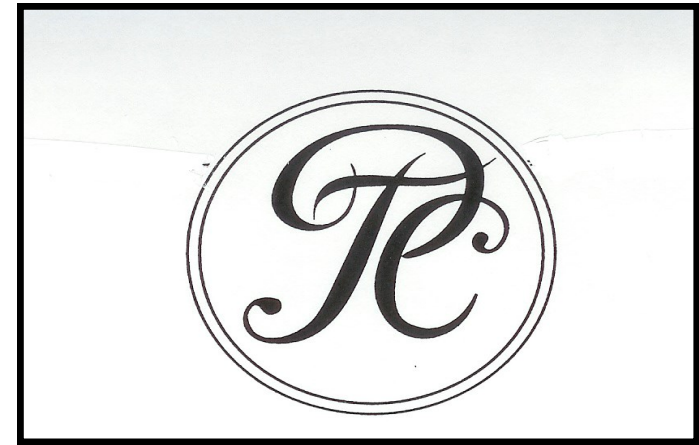

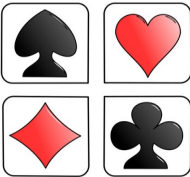

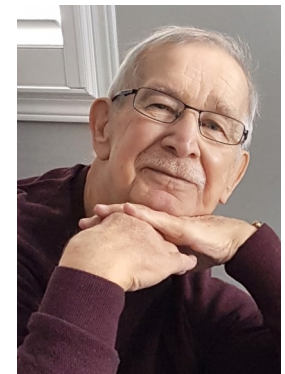

THE KEEP FIT KORNER



EASE PAIN WITH MOVEMENT ♀

Achy? A bit of exercise may help you heal. When you’re in pain, you’re probably not thinking about exercising but it’s quite helpful for most kinds of discomfort. Movement is natures pain medication. Exercise pushes blood oxygen and helpful biochemicals into injured or painful muscles, joints, and nerves. This makes them feel better and helps them heal. Over time, muscles grow stronger, stress on surrounding joints and tissues decreases, and stiffness reduces while flexibility increases.

CARDIO and STRENGTH are KEY

Aerobics exercise is especially helpful for most types of discomfort because it increases circulation, reduces inflammation, and stimulates endorphin release and serotonin production. Strength is equally important. Strong muscles act as shock absorbers taking pressure off joints.

Stay active » to ease pain.
Warm up » gentle, slower movements prepare your muscles and joints for next level of activity.
If in pain » modify your routine. You may need to shorten your workout or reduce the intensity, like we do in our Keep Fit programs. Taking fewer steps, lifting lighter weights, doing fewer reps, using chairs and choosing sitting positions for more support. Avoid back-to-back days of activities that may aggravate pain.

LISTEN to YOUR BODY

Steady progress allows your body to adapt and helps prevent flare ups. Some soreness or muscle fatigue is normal, but sharp or worsening pain is a signal to consult with your physician.

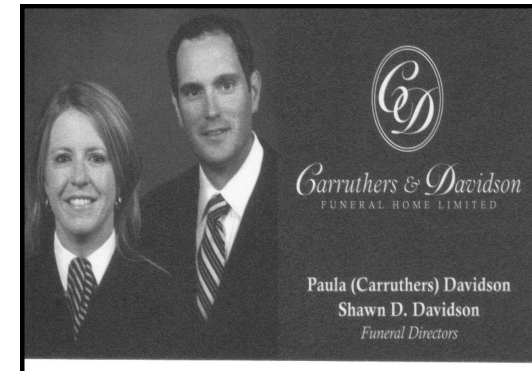
Others have never played before, except for the matching pairs game on-line, which is nothing like the game we play at the Club.
